Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Marana to open soon

The Arizona Veterans Memorial Cemetery at Marana has been under construction for over a year and is almost complete. Dedication ceremonies are scheduled for Saturday, March 26, 2016 at 10 a.m. As we get closer to the date, watch our emails and the news media for directions and further information.

For those planning ahead for a burial in a veterans cemetery, the Marana location will provide an option close to Tucson. Pre-registration is possible, which provides the cemetery with your basic information so most of the paperwork will already have been completed in advance. Burial benefits for deceased Air National Guard members

Question: Are retired members of the Air National Guard eligible for military veterans burial benefits? Answer: Yes, but benefits may vary depending on where you are buried and type of burial.

Qualifications for benefits are as follows: Any deceased veteran discharged under honorable conditions or (in some cases) some who are discharged under other than honorable conditions. As an Air National Guard Retiree you are considered an Air Force Retiree (check out your retirees ID card) and are eligible for burial benefits. A copy of your DD214 (separation from active duty) or NGB 22 (separation from National Guard) is required to acquire benefits. Funeral directors should know what to do but they will need your separation form to initiate the benefits.

During your memorial service, wherever you chose to have it, you are also entitled to a military honor guard. Your funeral director will know how to contact the proper personnel for an Honor Guard. All veterans are entitled to a granite or marble headstone (regardless of the cemetery), and a flag. In a veterans cemetery there will be no charge for opening or closing the grave, a vault or liner, or setting the marker. In a private cemetery there may be a charge for these services. Usually, a family is responsible for all other expenses including transportation to the cemetery.

We highly recommend you know where your military separation forms are, that you write down your desires, and decide on your burial location while you are still alive. This will make it much easier on your surviving family members when you're gone.

To get specific information go to the "va.gov" web site and click on Burials and Memorials. You can also go to the "azdvs.gov" website to check out Arizona Veterans Memorial Cemeteries. Those who don't have computer access can contact the Retirees Office and we will send you information.
