Copying your military ID card is against the law, with few exceptions

Copying of a U.S. Government ID card is a violation of federal law.

Some government agencies, such as police, are exceptions to the rule. Also, medical facilities (doctors, hospitals, etc.) can make copies for insurance claims purposes.

Showing your military ID to verify military service is OK, but don't let private organizations make a copy.

Whenever possible it's a smart idea to use another form of ID, such as your drivers license, to verify your identity. Show your military ID only when necessary. It's your identity; do everything you can to protect it!

When some early 162nd unit members pass away we sometimes have difficulty finding information. You can help us out

As time goes by there are occasions, when a former unit member passes away, that we recall a person being in the Guard but we don't know when, or how long, they were with us. Some people were in the unit 40 or 50 years ago and long since retired. Some retire after 20 years but don't stay in contact with us. Many did not stay for 20 years to retire from the unit and some moved on to pursue their military careers at other units. There are others who serve their time and move on to a civilian occupation.

Unfortunately, some folks left the unit without signing up on our retirees list so we have no way to contact them or their family. To further complicate things when people die today fewer obituaries are placed in the newspaper.

There is a reason we need this information. When a former unit member dies they could be eligible to have their names placed on our memorial. If they qualify it's our duty to see they are memorialized at the 162nd.

This is where you, our retirees, can help out. If you are still in contact with a former unit member and their family, and they die, please pass this info along to us as we may not know about it. A simple phone call or email is all we need. Once we know the name of a deceased person we will follow up and ensure that any obligations we may have to former unit members are fulfilled.
